We use wind

... in different ways. A sailing boat needs wind to move. Have you ever seen a big windmill? It produces electricity with the help of wind. Wind can be very dangerous too. Strong wind can blow a roof off a house. It can even push cars or big trucks over! There are many strong winds, for example tornadoes and hurricanes.

The European green lizard



The European green lizard is a **colourful** lizard that can grow up to 40 cm long. It lives in forests and likes to **hide** in bushes. The European green lizard is often hungry. It eats berries, insects, eggs, small birds and even mice.



The female lizard has dark spots and lines on its back.



Like most lizards, the European green lizard can **drop its tail** and grow a new one.

The male lizard has a blue face and neck, a green body and a brown tail.

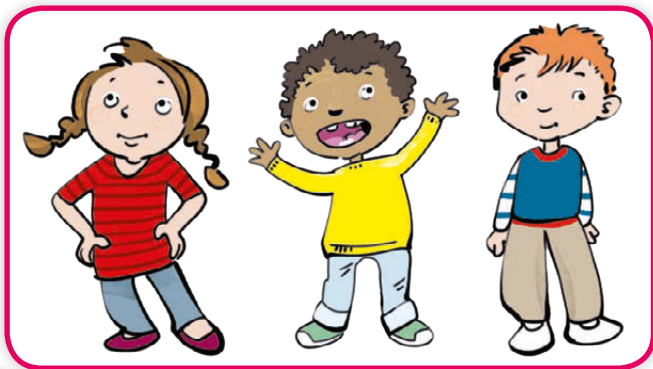

Some children make cards for their parents. They say thank you and I love you.

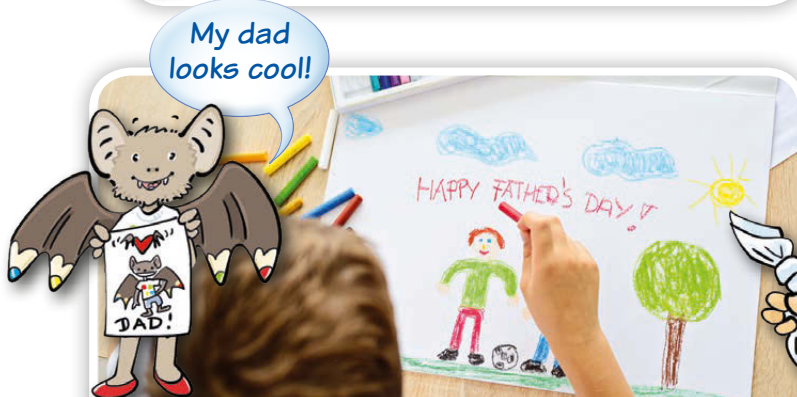


Some children like to make breakfast in bed for their mums and dads.
